From: Talking to Your Child About God. A Book for Families of All Faiths. David Heller. 1988

As we all know Christmas is so appealing to children. Understandably, many are anticipating the presents, and Christmas vacation. Try to set aside an evening or two during December to discuss the spirit of Christmas. Take some time and shut off the televisions, Ipods, phones, Xboxes, Playstations, and any other sometimes annoying electronics. Ask family members to talk about what Christmas means. For one family member, Christmas might mean a time for bright lights and singing. For someone else, it might be the baking of the cookies, decorations to put up, and the gifts to buy. Important to some are the family gatherings, and to others it might suggest a time of peace. Christmas can mean something unique to each member of your family. Of course, for everyone, it ultimately should mean the day of Christ's birth. Discuss with your child why this is significant to you and why it should be significant for them.

This will probably proceed best if family members are spontaneous, honest, and open. If it's feasible, include grandparents as well. The important thing is that adults and children share in the social and introspective experience. The atmosphere to inspire is one of warmth, togetherness, and open mindedness. Perhaps during meal time, when everyone is together is a good time for this discussion. This will help make Christmas an even more spiritual experience for your child than it might otherwise.



As the colder winds blow and we prepare to give thanks for the blessings in our lives this Thanksgiving our minds turn to the approaching holiday season. The Greater Galway Community Basket Project Planning Committee has already met and developed the December 2014 calendar for the project. It is our sincere hope that your organization or business will be able to help the project meet some of the needs of those families or individuals in our community who are encountering economic difficulties.

On the 24th of December 2013 the Project delivered 116 baskets. Each basket included a generous supply of food and gifts, including hats and mittens, for the 165 children in the recipient families.
